## **Biographical Note**

Emilie B. Hulin (d. 1931) was a Christian Science practitioner and teacher of Christian Science based in Brooklyn, New York.

In a 1906 letter to Mary Baker Eddy (published in the April 14, 1906 *Christian Science Sentinel*), Hulin said she "had been healed and interested in Christian Science" nearly two years before meeting Eddy in 1888. In May 1887 Hulin studied Christian Science with Pamelia J. Leonard, C.S.B., of Brooklyn.

Hulin's reminiscence, "Notes About Mary Baker Eddy," indicates that she was present as a "delegate" on June 13, 1888, when Eddy spoke at "a meeting of students and delegates from [Christian Science] Branch Churches" in Chicago. At the end of this meeting, Hulin met Eddy—an event she considered the "turning point" of her life. She was present the following day, when Eddy spoke on "Science and the Senses" at the Central Music Hall in Chicago. In her reminiscence, Hulin described witnessing Eddy's prominent public healing of an invalid woman in that audience.

In November 1888 Hulin took classes with Eddy and received the degree of C.S.D. (Doctor of Christian Science). She became an authorized teacher of Christian Science in September 1892 and a First Member of The Mother Church (The First Church of Christ, Scientist) the following year.

In addition to her work as a practitioner and teacher, Hulin worked for Eddy both in an official capacity and on a personal level, serving her when called throughout the rest of Eddy's life. She served on a committee involved with the 1894 construction of the Original Mother Church building and was responsible in particular for its stained glass windows.

In the course of her time as a Christian Scientist, Hulin filled a number of church offices. She was First Reader of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Brooklyn, New York, and was unanimously elected Vice-President of the Board of Education for the Mother Church in 1923. Among her various teaching responsibilities, Hulin instructed a Normal Class on Christian Science in December 1925. Shortly before her death on April 26, 1931, she completed her reminiscences of Eddy, in which she passionately expressed gratitude not just for Eddy's work in her lifetime but for the future as well.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The Emilie B. Hulin Papers have no series designations and are arranged into two folders of materials and a notebook. Items are arranged in chronological order within the folders, General Papers and December 1925

The papers consist largely of correspondence (mainly from others to Hulin). There is one letter from Hulin to the Christian Science Board of Directors. Additional materials include a Tenets and Rules pamphlet, some handwritten notes (including the text of a song), and one of Hulin's notebooks with her notes on Christian Science.

The General Papers folder contains correspondence on varied topics. Included are a 1923 letter from the Christian Science Board of Directors appointing Hulin as Vice-President of the Board of Education for The Mother Church; personal letters from friends of Hulin's (including Emma Easton Newman and Carlotta Mabury); and a request from Bertha Herd Merwin to be Hulin's student.

Materials in the December 1925 Normal Class folder predominantly include correspondence, as well as some related materials. The majority of the correspondence is from students of Hulin's December 1925 Normal Class to Hulin. These letters from students all include expressions of gratitude to Hulin; many students detailed the continuing importance of the Normal Class in their lives. Many also wrote of their desire or plans to teach their own classes as a result of Hulin's instruction.

The materials in the collection date from 1893–1926, with the bulk dating from late 1925 to early 1926. Materials are largely loose paper, and the majority are handwritten. One printed and bound (staples removed) booklet and one bound notebook are included.

In addition to the materials in this collection, other materials of Hulin's exist in different Library collections, including the Reminiscence File; The Mary Baker Eddy Outgoing Correspondence; a book Eddy inscribed to Hulin in the Mary Baker Eddy Autographed & Inscribed Books (L18442); and two items in the Art and Artifact collections.

The two artifacts are assigned catalog numbers. They are likely samples related to Eddy's request that Hulin assist with obtaining a new coiffure for Eddy. 1984.37.237.1 a lock of grey hair; 1984.37.237.2 a lock of white hair.
