Biographical Note

Laura E. Sargent (1858-1915)

Laura Ellen Adams was born April 26, 1858 in Green Bay, Wisconsin, the fifth and last child of Samuel & Minerva Adams.

The family had New England roots and had moved west in 1857, settling in Oconto, Wisconsin, a town known for its lumber trade. Laura attended school there.

In 1876 Laura married James Sargent, the brother-in-law of her sister Victoria. In 1883, Laura joined her friend Emma McDonald, who had introduced her to Christian Science, in Milwaukee, where she was healed of semiinvalidism through receiving treatment in Christian Science. On returning home, she shared *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* with her family, and as a result her mother and sisters both began to study Christian Science. She traveled to Chicago the following year to study under Mary Baker Eddy, attending her Primary class on May 13. This special class—the only one Eddy taught in the west—occurred after Christian Science had begun to take hold in the Midwest. In a June 1884 letter to Eldridge J. Smith, Eddy stated "this great work had been started but my students needed me to give it a right foundation and impulse in that city of ceaseless enterprise." Benefitting from that "right foundation," Laura healed her first patient, her mother, soon after the class. At Eddy's request, she and Victoria traveled to Boston to attend another Primary class that Eddy taught on December 22.

In May 1886 Laura enrolled in Eddy's Normal class at the Massachusetts Metaphysical College in Boston. Later that year she was among those involved in the construction of a church edifice in Oconto, stemming from the growth of Christian Science there. It was the first structure in the world specifically designated for Christian Science worship. At this time Laura began advertising in *The Christian Science Journal* as a Christian Science practitioner. The following year she taught her first Primary class. She became a member of The Mother Church (The First Church of Christ, Scientist, Boston) on September 23, 1892.

In 1890, Eddy called on Laura to join her household at 62 North State Street in Concord, New Hampshire. This marked the beginning of 20 years of employment; for much of that time she alternated working for Eddy in the Northeast and returning to Oconto. After 1903 Laura was permanently employed in Eddy's household. Many people, including other household staff and outsiders such as Sibyl Wilbur, as well as Eddy herself, would all remark on Laura's centrality to the management of both the Pleasant View household in Concord and the household in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts.

After Eddy died in 1910, the Christian Science Board of Directors appointed Laura custodian of Chestnut Hill, where she remained until her death in 1915. Additionally, she served on The Mother Church's Committee on Business and Bible Lesson Committee, and in 1913 was the second woman (after Eddy herself) to teach a Christian Science Normal class.

Victoria H. Sargent (1848–1930)

Victoria Hortense Adams was born May 28, 1848, in Bowdoinham, Maine, the third child of Samuel and Minerva Adams. She moved with her family to Oconto, Wisconsin in 1856. In 1866 she married Henry Sargent, a native of New Brunswick who had moved to Oconto to work in its lumber industry. They had two daughters, Minerva (Minnie) and Elizabeth (Bessie).

In May 1884 Victoria received a telegraph from her sister Laura, requesting that she join her at Eddy's Primary class in Chicago. She arrived too late to make the class, but did purchase *Science and Health* from Eddy. In her reminiscence, she recalled that while reading the book she was "perfectly healed of a complication of diseases." That December she traveled to Boston with Laura to take Primary class instruction from Eddy. Victoria was involved in the establishment of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Oconto, and although he was not himself a Christian Scientist, Henry donated the land for it. In 1889 Victoria was elected First Reader at this church, an office she held for five years.

On December 31, 1892, Victoria became a member of The Mother Church. In 1895 she taught her first Christian Science Primary class in Green Bay and served as Second Reader at First Church of Christ, Scientist, in that city.

While not a member of Eddy's household like her sister, Victoria remained close with Eddy through correspondence. At Eddy's request she traveled to Concord in 1907, to help by contributing specific prayer in connections with the Next Friends lawsuit, in which Eddy was engaged. After Laura's death in 1915, the Christian Science Board of Directors appointed Victoria custodian of Eddy's property in Chestnut Hill, a position she held until her own passing in 1930.

Minnie S. McDonald (c. 1869-1950)

Minerva (Minnie) Sargent was born circa 1869, the elder daughter of Victoria and Henry Sargent. She married Will McDonald in a ceremony officiated by Rev. Lanson P. Norcross at First Church of Christ, Scientist, Oconto. His parents, Hugh and Emma McDonald, were friends who introduced Laura Sargent, Minnie's aunt, to Christian Science. She became a member of The Mother Church on July 1, 1893. After her mother's death in 1930, the Christian Science Board of Directors appointed her custodian of the Chestnut Hill property, a position she filled until her death in 1950.

Scope and Content Note

The Sargent and McDonald Family Collection includes printed materials owned by members of the Sargent and McDonald families, as well as photographs depicting these families and related people and places. The collection contains two series. Series I, Printed Materials, is arranged by the order of each item's assigned accession number. Series II, Photographs, is arranged by assigned "P" number. The collection is described at the item level.

Series I, Printed Materials, consists of 15 books, as well as one set of two books, and a 1946 *Christian Science Quarterly* in a leather case. Many of the books were owned by members of the Sargent and McDonald families, and many contain inscriptions. Most books are writings of Mary Baker Eddy, including six copies of *Science and Health*

with Key to the Scriptures, two Christian Science Hymnals, and other titles. There are also three Bibles and one other religious title, *Daily Light on the Daily Path*. The collection also includes five postcards, a leaflet on the history of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Oconto, and a clipping of Victoria Sargent's obituary from an unidentified newspaper. The postcards depict First Church of Christ, Scientist, Oconto; Eddy's Chestnut Hill residence; The Mother Church; and a historic cottage in Green Bay. Dates for items in Series I reflect dates of inscription rather than publication.

Series II, Photographs, contains photographs depicting the Sargent and McDonald families (primarily Laura, Victoria, Minnie, and members of Minnie's extended family); other members of Eddy's household (including Adam H. Dickey, William and Ella Rathvon, Adelaide Still, and others); and the grounds at Chestnut Hill. Photograph numbers with decimal points reflect images that were previously represented in the collection by other photographs, prior to the donation of the Sargent and McDonald Family Collection. Those related items can be found in the Historic Photographs Collection.

Related Collections

Materials related to this collection, including the Sargent sisters' correspondence to and from Eddy, can be found in The Mary Baker Eddy Collection, in Incoming Correspondence, Outgoing Correspondence, and Autographed and Inscribed Books; in the Subject File; and in the Reminiscence File. Additional photographs of the Sargent and McDonald families can be found in the Historic Photographs Collection.
