Biographical Note

Paul S. Deland was born September 26, 1881, in North Brookfield, Massachusetts. He attended public schools in Worcester, Massachusetts, and at Williston Academy in Easthampton, Massachusetts. On June 26, 1907, he married Viola M. Smith.

Deland was a student of Christian Science, and an understanding of it was of particular interest to him. In his 1938 reminiscence, he stated that, before joining *The Christian Science Monitor*, he read parts of *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* and some articles published in the *Christian Science Sentinel*.

In 1906 Deland traveled around greater Boston as a journalist for the *Boston American* and a photographer for *The Boston Traveler*. In 1907 he met Mary Baker Eddy in her Concord, New Hampshire, home, to take pictures for a press interview. The following year he started at the *Monitor*, at the time of its founding. During his tenure he served in many positions that included reporter, copy editor, financial editor, American news editor, and managing editor. He played an important part in the development of the news staff. He was also a member of the paper's editorial staff from 1936 to 1939. He was one of few original staff members on the roster at the time of the *Monitor's* fiftieth anniversary in 1958. He retired on December 1 of that same year but remained actively interested in the paper.

Outside of the *Monitor*, Deland participated in and served a variety of organizations. In 1930 the governor of Massachusetts appointed him to the Conference of Metropolitan Boston. The following year, the Massachusetts Legislature authorized him to serve on the committee under the Department of Labor and Industries, investigating reasons of unemployment. He was a board member of the Massachusetts Temperance League, a 32nd-degree Mason, past patron of the Order of the Eastern Star, a permanent trustee of Williston Academy, and a member of Sigma Delta Chi. In 1963 he received the Yankee Quill Award of the New England Chapter of Sigma Delta Chi.

Deland died on March 22, 1965, in Wellesley, Massachusetts, survived by his wife.

The papers of Paul S. Deland include one (1) folder and two (2) flat boxes. The folder contains a leaflet titled "Assignment: Mankind: A Documentary Film about The Christian Science Monitor" which describes that film and its production crew.

Additionally, the folder contains copies of production photographs of the same film. The two flat boxes are the first and second volumes of Paul Deland's retirement scrapbook. It contains written and typed correspondence, newsletters, newspaper clippings, photographs, greeting cards, and illustrations from colleagues and friends who gave thanks, well wishes, and congratulations for his 50 years of service at the time of his retirement.

The folder is arranged in order of the separated materials, P08935-P08954. The scrapbooks are arranged in its original order.
